

Specification:

Component 1 : Drama - Students will study two Drama texts: one Shakespeare; one other (Streetcar Named Desire). They will be assessed through a single-question exam in which they will compare the two texts.

Component 2: Prose: Students will compare two novels connected by a similar theme: one pre-1900; one post-. They will be assessed through a single-question exam in which they will compare the two texts. Possible texts include Mrs Dalloway, Wuthering Heights, Tess of the D'Urbervilles

Component 3: Poetry: Students will study a named poet or poetic movement, answering a question on a collection of work. They will also be examined on a taught poetry anthology that will be compared to an unseen poem.

Coursework: Students will write a single comparative, critical essay on two selected texts. These will be decided by the individual student, as will the question. Students will work on this independently with support from their teacher and produce a detailed essay of no more than 3000 words.

In the second year of the A-level you'll deepen your understanding of human behaviour. You'll study additional topics under Approaches in psychology, Biopsychology, Research methods and Issues and debates in psychology. You then study three further topics:

Philosophy of Religion – Ancient philosophical influences, arguments about the existence and non-existence of God, the nature of soul, mind and body, the nature and impact of religious experience, ideas about the nature of God, ideas about life after death, the challenge to religious belief of the problem of evil.

Religion and Ethics - Major ethical theories such as Utilitarianism and Kantian ethics; ethical theories from a religious perspective, such as Natural Law & Situation Ethics; application to ethical theories in Sexual Ethics and Business Ethics; what do we mean by Free Will, Conscience, Right, Wrong.

Developments in Christian Thought – The Christian Scriptures as a source of wisdom and authority, Christian understandings on the afterlife, ideas about salvation and whether all religions offer equally effective paths to God, the challenge of secularism for religion, significant social and historical developments in Christian thought.
