St. Anne's Summer Exhibition 2022: 'A Line Around Our Thoughts'

This year the St. Anne's Summer Exhibition displayed work across three areas of the Upper Site. Stretching from the hall to the Key Stage 4 Art rooms, up to the Sixth form A-Level Art studio: the show was an immersive experience of students' work. For the first time the work of Key Stage 3 Art students was welcomed to the upper site, and every single student studying art across the school had a piece in the exhibition – quite a feat for the Art Department!

Inspired by Gustav Klimt's quote, the show explored the range of creative thinking within the school, including our talented students attending Art lessons here from St. Ignatius. From the large-scale tea party installation to the abstract art pieces and immersive installations created by Key Stage 5, the depth of thinking and immense ambitions of the students was on display for staff and parents to proudly see.

The return of life drawing this year has brought great skill-based confidence to students as well as pride to the department, with an entire studio wall filled with students' accomplishments during these workshops on display during the exhibition. This year has also brought great sculptural achievements for many A-Level students suspending their explorations from great heights, with students having a full year to practice in the Art studios for the first time since the pandemic.







Overall, this year has been about students getting back into the swing of things and trusting their creative instincts after two years of absence and uncertainty. We are very proud of the work they have achieved this year, and hope that the sense of pride they and their families felt during the exhibition matches that of the Art department for their endurance and dedication this year.

Mad Hatter's Tea Project



Four Year 7 Classes took part in a Mad Hatter's Tea Project with Ms Vorraso.
